10 ORDINANCE NO. 2019 - 43

12 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING FNSBC 7.04.030 TO AUTHORIZE THE AUTOMATIC  
13 APPROPRIATION OF SMALL DOLLAR GRANTS  
14

15 WHEREAS, The Fairbanks North Star Borough (Borough) is occasionally  
16 awarded small-dollar grants and often those grants have a short performance period;  
17 and  
18

19 WHEREAS, The appropriation process, with time and effort required from  
20 both the Administration and the Assembly, costs the Borough many times the value of a  
21 small-dollar grant.  
22

23 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Assembly of the Fairbanks  
24 North Star Borough:  
25

26 Section 1. This ordinance is of a general and permanent nature and shall  
27 be codified.  
28

29 Section 2. FNSBC 7.04.030, Appropriation of Funds, is hereby amended  
30 as follows:  
31

32 A. The assembly may from time to time authorize the expenditure of borough  
33 moneys by appropriating ordinance. Except as specified in [SUBSECTION (B) OF] this  
34 section, no person shall obligate, encumber, or expend borough moneys except in  
35 accordance with appropriations or as otherwise authorized by law.

36 B. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (A) of this section, the chief  
37 financial officer of the borough may expend moneys from the central treasury without  
38 prior appropriation for:

- 39 1. Investment of funds;
- 40 2. Establishment of ready cash fund;
- 41 3. Refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the borough;
- 42 4. Payments to municipalities in the borough or the state for their respective  
revenues collected by the borough;

43 5. Payments of any obligations incurred when the provisions of FNSBC  
44 7.12.050(C) apply.

45 C. Unless the assembly provides otherwise by ordinance:

46 1. The borough moneys necessary to pay the principal and interest then due,  
47 or to become due during a given fiscal year, on general obligation bonds, revenue  
48 bonds, bond anticipation notes, tax anticipation notes, and other similar obligations  
49 issued by the borough are appropriated on July 1st of each fiscal year from the fund  
50 balance of the fund from which the said principal and interest would normally and  
51 routinely be paid.

52 2. As related to general obligation bonds or other similar obligations issued  
53 by the borough, the borough moneys necessary to make, or cause to be made, all  
54 computations, filings, and payments necessary to meet the requirements of the United  
55 States Internal Revenue Code, and to pay other costs, if any, to comply with other bond  
56 covenants, then due or to become due during a given fiscal year, are appropriated on  
57 July 1st of each fiscal year from funds available or to become available in the debt  
58 service fund.

59 D. The borough chief financial officer, or the superintendent of schools or their  
60 designee, is authorized to accept monetary gifts, donations, and bequests made to the  
61 borough or to the school district respectively, in a total value not exceeding \$1,000  
62 from any one donor in any one fiscal year. Gifts to the school district exceeding \$1,000  
63 shall be accepted by the school board and reported to the assembly. All other gifts must  
64 be accepted by the mayor or their designee and shall be reported to the assembly,  
65 except that gifts over \$50,000 or gifts from a borough contractor for use in the  
66 performance of a borough contract must be accepted by the assembly. Gifts accepted  
67 without designation as to use thereof shall be treated as miscellaneous revenue in the  
68 general fund. To the extent consistent with law, any designated gifts accepted by the  
69 mayor from a nongovernmental organization, individual, or estate are appropriated for  
70 the specific purpose designated by the donor. Notwithstanding the provisions of FNSBC  
71 7.04.120(A), any appropriation made under this section shall be treated as a capital  
72 improvement and the lapsing provisions of FNSBC 7.04.120(B) will apply.

73 E. Revenue from sales of surplus library books and materials is hereby appropriated  
74 for the purchase of new library books and materials.

75 F. Revenue from the sale of abandoned vehicles and parts is appropriated to the  
76 abandoned vehicle removal program.

77 G. The mayor, with the concurrence of the chief financial officer, is authorized to  
78 accept a grant that is less than \$10,000. These funds are hereby appropriated for the  
79 purpose indicated in the grant agreement.

80  
81 Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance is effective at 5:00 p.m. on the  
82 first Borough business day following its adoption.


